There is a great article in this month's newsletter on the importance of motor skills. The great thing about developing small and large muscle skills is that it happens naturally through play — lots of play.

That is why our curriculum is developed around play. The skills that your child is learning here in preschool create a wonderful foundation for literacy and math skills, as well as social, emotional, and problem-solving skills.

Dr. Meyerhoff, an author and researcher with the Harvard Preschool Project says, "Young children are learning to learn. As they indulge their natural inclinations to explore, investigate, and experiment through developmentally appropriate play, they acquire the fundamental concepts and capacities that allow them to effectively absorb from — and adapt to — the ever-changing environment around them for the rest of their lives.
